About English for Academic Purposes

This 12-week course is intended for Upper Intermediate level EAP 2 students who need to improve their language skills to succeed in an English-speaking academic setting. There is a major emphasis on the many reading and listening abilities and methods required for academic success, as well as a detailed study of the various writing styles required. The important academic speaking skills of discussion and presentation are covered in detail. The course seeks to improve students' study abilities while also providing them with an understanding of the culture and expectations they will face at university in an English-speaking environment.

Entry Requirements

- Minimum age 16 years old
- Upper Intermediate level English / IELTS 5.5 or 6.0 depending on the university programme requirement

Course Length

12 weeks

Sample Learner Outcomes

On successful completion of this course students will:

- be able to write effective academic essays
- be more aware of various study skills, such as using libraries, referencing, organising their time, giving presentations and exam and study techniques
- be able to participate in academic discussions
- be better able to listen to academic lectures and use effective note-taking strategies, such as noting key words, numbers, and statistics, as well as main ideas and supporting details

EAP 2 is delivered face-to-face and online from CCEL's campus location for 20 hours a week. Online study is only available to offshore students. Our maximum class size is 18 students.
